# THE COMMITTEE

# **Mandate of the Committee**

1. The Standing Finance Committee is established by House of Representatives Standing Order 82(1) of the House of Representatives Standing Orders. It is the duty of the Committee to consider the Estimates and the Appropriation Bill. The Committee is also empowered by House of Representatives Standing Order 87(1) to consider and report on all proposals for expenditure which are not included in the Annual Estimates including proposals for supplementary and unforeseen expenditure.

# **Membership**

2 In accordance with the House of Representatives Standing Order 82(1), this Committee is a Committee of the Whole House of Representatives and is chaired by the Speaker.

# Meeting

- 3. The Committee held a public meeting on Monday January 27, 2020 at 10:00 a.m. The Minutes of the Meeting is attached at Appendix II.
- 4. The purpose of this meeting was to consider proposals for the variation of the appropriation provided in the Appropriation (Financial Year 2019) Act, 2018 and varied by the Finance (Supplementary Appropriation) (Financial Year 2019) Act, 2019. The Schedule relating to the variation of estimates for fiscal 2019 is at **Appendix V**.

# **Variation**

- 5. The Standing Finance Committee considered and approved a Variation to the Appropriation for fiscal year 2019 in the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty-Five Million, Three Hundred and Sixty-Nine Thousand, Eight Hundred and Seventy-Four Dollars (\$255,369,874).
- 6. The variation reflects the provision of additional funds in the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty-Five Million, Three Hundred and Sixty- Nine Thousand, Eight Hundred and Seventy-Four Dollars (\$255,369,874) to bring to account Debit Advices for the period December 2018 to September 2019 in order to meet the payment of the Interest on the Overdraft with the Central Bank.
- 7. The Standing Finance Committee noted savings in fiscal 2019 identified under the Ministry of Public Utilities in the sum of \$255.37Mn.

# Write-offs

- 8. The Standing Finance Committee considered and approved write-offs in the sum of Seven Million, One Hundred and Twenty- Five Thousand, Four Hundred and Forty- Six Dollars and Seventy- Three Cents (\$7,125,446.73):
  - The first write-off relates to the overpayment of Salaries and Cost of Living Allowance in the sum of Six Million, Seven Hundred and Twelve Thousand and Forty-Five Dollars and Ninety Two Cents (\$6,712,045.92) to 1,008 Teachers consequent on the Implementation of the Classification and Compensation Plan for the Teaching Service for the period January 1, 1999 to September 30, 2002;
  - The second write-off relates to the overpayment of Salaries in the sum of One Hundred and Ninety Six Thousand, Nine Hundred Dollars and Forty Five Cents (\$196,900.45) to Ms. Neltrice Birch, former Technical Vocation Teacher III (TVT III), Diego Martin Government Secondary School for the period January 8, 1996 to January

- 28, 2010.
- The third write off relates to an overpayment of Salaries and COLA in the sum of Ninety- Three Thousand, Five Hundred and Thirty-Six Dollars and Eighteen Cents (\$93,536.18) to Mr. Rajcoomar Bhagaloo retired Revenue Officer II, Inland Revenue Division, Ministry of Finance.
- The fourth write off relates to an overpayment of salary and allowances in the sum of Seventy-One Thousand, Nine Hundred and Forty-Two Dollars and Eight Cents (\$71,942.08) to Mr. Dave Nurse, former Transport Superintendent, Port of Spain Corporation for the period January 1, 1976 to December 31, 1999.
- The final write-off in the sum of Fifty- One Thousand and Twenty-Two Dollars and Ten Cents (\$51,022.10) represents an overpayment of salary to Mr. Keith Mora, former Pound Keeper, Port of Spain Corporation for the period November 21, 1991 to December 31, 2008.

# **Transfers**

- 9. The Standing Finance Committee noted that the Minister of Finance approved the transfer of funds in the sum of:
  - One Billion, Three Hundred and Ten Million, Thirty- Four Thousand and Seven Hundred and Four Dollars (\$1,310,034,704) between Sub – Heads under the same Heads of Expenditure for fiscal year 2019. (See Appendix IV).
- 10. The transfers were approved by the Minister, based on Notes from the respective Ministries requesting transfers between Sub-Heads, and reflect changed circumstances in Ministries and Departments and a consequential re-ordering of priorities.

# Recommendations

## Variation

11. The Committee recommends the Variation to the Appropriation for fiscal year 2019 in the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty-Five Million, Three Hundred and Sixty- Nine Thousand, Eight Hundred and Seventy- Four Dollars (\$255,369,874).

## Write-off of Losses

- The Committee recommends the write-off of losses in the sum of Seven Million, One Hundred and Twenty- Five Thousand, Four Hundred and Forty- Six Dollars and Seventy-Three Cents (\$7,125,446.73):

- 1.4 The procedure for the consideration of the Heads of Expenditure was outlined.

#### **TRANSFERS**

2.1 The Committee noted that the Minister of Finance approved the transfer of funds in the sum of \$1,310,034,704 between Sub-Heads under the same Head of Expenditure for fiscal year 2019. These transfers reflect changed circumstances in Ministries and Departments and a consequential re-ordering of priorities.

#### PROPOSALS FOR THE VARIATION OF APPROPRIATION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2019

#### Head 39: Ministry of Public Utilities - Decrease

- 3.1 The Chairman announced Head 39, Ministry of Public Utilities, a decrease in the sum of \$255,369,874.
- 3.2 The Minister of Public Utilities was invited to make a brief opening statement for a maximum of five (5) minutes.
- 3.3 The Chairman proposed the question that Head 39, Ministry of Finance be varied by a decrease in the sum of \$255,369,874.
- 3.4 The Members for Caroni Central, Caroni East, Chaguanas West, Siparia and Tabaquite sought clarification. Thereafter, the Minister of Finance and the Attorney General provided an explanation for the decrease.
- 3.5 The question was put and agreed that Head 39, Ministry of Public Utilities be varied by a decrease in the sum of \$255,369,874.

#### Total Decreases

3.6 The question was put and agreed that the Appropriation for fiscal year 2019 be varied by a total decrease of \$255,369,874.

#### **Head 18: Ministry of Finance - Increase**

- 3.7 The Chairman announced Head 18, Ministry of Finance, an increase in the sum of \$255,369,874.
- 3.8 The Minister of Finance was invited to make a brief opening statement for a maximum of five (5) minutes.

- 3.9 The Chairman proposed the question that Head 18, Ministry of Finance be varied by an increase in the sum of \$255,369,874.
- 3.10 The Members for Caroni Central and Caroni East sought clarification from the Minister. The Minister of Finance provided an explanation for the purpose of the increase.
- 3.11 The question was put and agreed that Head 18, Ministry of Finance be varied by an increase in the sum of \$255,369,874.

#### **Total Increases**

3.12 The question was put and agreed that the Appropriation for fiscal year 2019 be varied by a total increase of \$255,369,874.

- 3.17 The question was put and agreed that losses in the sum of \$6,908,946.37 for Head 26, Ministry of Education be written-off.

- 2. The matter for the consideration of the Standing Finance Committee is the write-off of Salaries and Cost of Living Allowance totaling \$6,712,045.92 to 1,008 Teachers consequent on the Implementation of the Classification and Compensation Plan for the Teaching Service for the period January 1<sup>st</sup>, 1999 to September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2002.
- 3. The overpayment arose as the salary conversion principle outlined by the Chief Personnel Officer in her memorandum dated November 09, 2000 was misinterpreted and increments to the Teachers were paid at the incorrect point.
- 4. The Minister of Education recommended and Cabinet agreed that the sum of \$6,712,045.92 be written off.
- 5. Accordingly, the Standing Finance Committee is asked to approve the write-off in the sum of \$6,712,045.92 to 1,008 Teachers for the period January 1st, 1999 to September 30th, 2002 as detailed in the attached Schedule.

Write-off of the overpayment of Salaries in the sum of \$196,900.45 to Ms. Neltrice Birch, former Technical Vocation Teacher III (TVT III), Diego Martin Government Secondary School, Ministry of Education

- 6. The matter for the consideration of the Standing Finance Committee is the write-off of an overpayment of Salary in the sum of \$196,900.45 to Ms. Neltrice Birch, former Technical Vocation Teacher III (TVT III), Diego Martin Government Secondary School for the period January 08, 1996 to January 28, 2010.
- 7. Ms. Birch obtained her first appointment in the Public Service as a Clerk Stenographer I/II with

effect from August 08, 1974 and subsequently obtained approval from the Teaching Service Commission (TSC) to be appointed on secondment to Technical Vocational Teacher I (TVT I) with effect from August 30, 1990.

- 8. Ms. Birch was subsequently reassessed as TVT III on obtaining additional qualifications, however the Teaching Service promoted her to TVT IV with effect from January 08, 1996 and she would have performed the duties of the office.
- 9. The Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Education informed the TSC that Ms. Birch was inadvertently promoted to TVT IV although she was assessed as TVT III and also of her notice to retire voluntarily from the Teaching Service with effect from January 29, 2010.
- 10. The TSC subsequently cancelled the promotion of Ms. Birch to TVT IV and promoted her as a TVT III with effect from January 08, 1996
- 11. The Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Education petitioned the TSC to reconsider the revocation of Ms. Birch's promotion but was unsuccessful as her qualification did not satisfy the requirement for TVT IV.
- 12. The Minister of Education recommended and Cabinet agreed to the write-off of the overpayment in the sum of \$196,900.45.
- 13. Accordingly, the Standing Finance Committee is asked to approve the write-off in the sum of \$196,900.45 to Ms. Neltrice Birch, former Technical Vocation Teacher III (TVT III), Diego Martin Government Secondary School, Ministry of Education.

#### Ministry of Finance - \$93,536.18

Write-off of the overpayment of Salaries in the sum of \$\$93,536.18 to Mr. Rajcoomar Bhagaloo retired Revenue Officer II, Inland Revenue Division, Ministry of Finance

- 14. - Overtime \$50,000
- Allowances \$20,000
- Government's Contribution to NIS \$105,000

#### Head 06 – Service Commissions - \$686,000

#### **Reason for Transfer**

To facilitate the payment of arrears of Salaries, Salaries and COLA and Allowances as follows:-

- Salaries and COLA \$400,000
- Allowances (Monthly Paid Officers) \$86,000
- Government's Contribution to NIS \$170,000
- •Government's Contribution to Group Health Insurance \$30,000

#### **Reason for Savings**

Savings were identified as the contractual services were not engaged to undertake the filling of the offices of Deputy Permanent Secretaries as planned. This process will be undertaken in fiscal 2020 - \$686,000.

#### <u>Head 13 – Office of the Prime Minister - \$410,500</u>

#### **Reason for Transfer**

To facilitate the completion of the procurement process of Phase 4 of the "Support and Strengthening of the Strategic Threat Assessment Capacity in Trinidad and Tobago – Think Tank Project" of the Integrated Threat Assessment Centre (ITAC) - \$410,500.

#### **Reason for Savings**

Increased efficiency in the utilization of funds by the National Security Council has realized savings of \$410,500.

To enable the payment of interest pending the refinancing of a US\$64.2Mn loan under Caribbean Airlines Debt Servicing - \$5,853,673.

To effect payment to GROUP DCLLC for lobbying services in Washington DC on behalf of the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago (GORTT) - \$6,300,000.

To bring to account debit advices with respect to the interest on the overdraft facility with the Central Bank - \$757,800,000.

#### **Reasons for Savings**

Contribution to Caribbean Development Bank. The finalization of the amount to be paid is not yet settled. It is expected to be finalized in 2020 - \$77,500,000.

State Liability and Proceeding Act Chap. 8:02 – some requests for settlement were not submitted in a timely manner to be paid in 2019 - \$13,200,000.

The Food Price Support Programme was reviewed which resulted in a reduction of persons meeting the qualifying criteria for the issuance of food cards - \$32,000,000.

The Voluntary Separation of Employment Package for the Central Tenders Board was not implemented because the VSEP process was not finalized in 2019 - \$12,000,000.

Government's Contribution to the Children's Life Fund – The Schedule of Disbursement of funds indicated that funds required was less than the 2019 provision - \$23,700,000.

Infrastructure Development Fund – Expenditure under the Fund did not materialize as initially projected as some programmes/projects could not be implemented. Additionally, some bills presented for payments could not be processed as the verification/auditing of the scope of works completed by contractors were not finalized - \$156,500,000.

CARICOM Development Fund – A smaller sum was negotiated to be paid as contribution for 2019 - \$36,000,000.

First Citizens Bank Limited Indemnity Calls – The Company's accounts were sufficiently funded to support its activities for 2019 - \$66,100,000.

Private/Public Housing Construction Incentive Programme – funding was not required during fiscal 2019 as the policy guidelines for the Programme were not fully developed to allow for implementation - \$50,000,000.

Policy guidelines to administer both the Business Stimulus Programme and the Fiscal Incentive Programme for Farmers were not finalized in fiscal 2019. The respective sums of \$37,800,000 and \$20,000,000 were available.

Agricultural Development Bank – The Bank's accounts were sufficiently funded to support its activities for 2019 - \$25,000,000.

Trinidad and Tobago International Financial Centre – The request for funds was submitted after the close of the financial year - \$30,000,000.

Community Improvement Services Ltd. (CISL) – the funds were to enable payment pending the outcome of an ongoing legal matter which was not completed in 2019 - \$43,900,000.

Tourism Development Company Limited - the funds were provided for an interim payment pending the outcome of an ongoing legal which was not finalized in 2019 - \$26,100,000.

Trinidad and Tobago Mortgage Finance Company – The request for subvention was received after the close of fiscal 2019 - \$120,153,673.

#### Head 22 – Ministry of National Security - \$166,940,000

#### **Reasons for Transfer**

To facilitate the scheduled delivery for the design and procurement of two (2) 58 metre Cape Class Patrol Boats to be used for National patrol - \$141,740,000.

To procure food and supplies for patrol dogs and supplies for the inmates at the Prison - \$4,000,000. To purchase food for the inmates at the Prison - \$3,000,000.

To purchase fuel and lubricants for bulk and service fleet cards - \$600,000.

To pay Amalgamated Security for transport of prisoners for August 2018 – September 2019 - \$5,000,000.

To undertake repairs to buildings, perimeter fences, AC units and generators at the Prison - \$2,000,000.

To pay the 70% owed for the supply of seven (7) armoured vehicles for the Regiment - \$6,000,000. To meet expenditure under the Employee Assistance Programme for prison staff - \$600,000.

To purchase equipment including stab-proof vest, firearms, ammunition and hand held scanners for

use by Prison Service - \$4.000.000.

The delay in recruitment of 250 Prison Officers to the end of fiscal 2019 yielded savings as follows:-

01 – Salaries and COLA - \$16,000,000

04 – Allowances - \$ 9,200,000

The Ministry's contract for the CCTV cameras expired in June 2017 and a new contract came into force in September 2019 resulting in unutilized funds - \$141,740,000.

#### Head 23 – Ministry of the Attorney General and Legal Affairs - \$5,400,000

#### **Reasons for Transfer**

To enable the payment of arrears of Salaries and Salaries to staff at the Legal Aid and Advisory Authority - \$2,000,000.

To enable the payment of arrears of Salaries and Salaries to staff at the Police Complaints Authority - \$100,000.

To enable the payment of Salaries, Allowances and Government's Contribution to NIS - \$800,000. To enable payment of Salaries to contract workers under the new terms and conditions of employment - \$2,500,000.

#### **Reasons for Savings**

Due to delays in implementation of the Modernization of the Companies Registry, the payment scheduled for 2019 was changed resulting in savings - \$3,600,000.

The initial site identified for the District Registration Office was no longer available and a new site has to be identified - \$600,000.

The Anti-Corruption Investigation Bureau moved from under the purview of the Ministry resulting in cessation of expenditure incurred by the Ministry- \$300,000.

Saving on the cost of work on the Intellectual Property office arose as the balance of expenditure to be incurred will be met from Recurrent Expenditure - \$400,000.

Lease/Rental of a building which was to be utilized by the Director of Public Prosecutions (South) did not materialize as the relevant approvals were not obtained - \$500,000.

#### <u>Head 26 – Ministry of Education - \$141,820,366</u>

#### **Reasons for Transfer**

To meet payment of Salaries and COLA to Primary and Secondary School Teachers up to September 30, 2019 - \$73,200,000.

To enable partial payment for the Trinidad and Tobago national students enrolled at Hugh Wooding Law School for academic year 2017/2018 - \$24,800,000.

To enable the payment of Salaries to staff at several Technical/Vocation Centres and in Programmes including MIC, MUST and HYPE and the associated operational costs - \$8,280,929.

To meet payment of tuition fees and allowance to local and overseas students who were awarded National and Additional Scholarships - \$35,539,437.

#### **Reasons for Savings**

Savings were realized under the Personnel Expenditure of the Eastern Caribbean Institute of Agriculture and Forestry as approvals for acting appointments and increments were not finalized - \$1,200,000.

Funds provided for the purchase of laptops for Primary and Secondary Schools under Minor Equipment Purchases were utilized for meeting urgent obligations, such as payment of Salaries - \$38,000,000.

Funds which were provided under Current Transfers and Subsidies to meet costs of fees and grants for students enrolled at Private Special Schools were utilized from as the number of students enrolled for 2018/2019 academic year were less than projected - \$7,600,000.

Funds provided for Grants to Government Secondary Schools – Educational Programme were utilized as the Ministry re-prioritized to meet the payment of Salaries to Primary and Secondary School Teachers - \$26,400,000.

Savings were realized from the National Training Agency, National Energy Skills Centre and Accreditation Council of Trinidad and Tobago allocations as their bank and financial statements revealed that there were sufficient funds to meet the expenditure for fiscal 2019 - \$13,546,000.

Savings were also realized from the Trinidad and Tobago Hospitality and Tourism Institute as they received funds from private companies and were able to operate without Government's funding - \$1,271,000.

Savings were realized from National Commission for Higher Education (NCHE), Bursaries/Financial Assistance – Tertiary and St. Augustine Education City as the Cabinet Appointed Committees to manage their respective funds were not yet installed - \$722,437.

Savings were realized from the Statutory Boards, National Institute of Higher Education (Research, Science and Technology) and College of Science, Technology and Applied Arts of Trinidad and Tobago as a review of their bank and financial statements revealed they had sufficient funds to meet their operational costs for 2019 - \$20,000,000.

Savings were obtained from several projects under the Ministry's Development Programme:-

- Development works at the University of the West Indies on completion of the project the UWI paid the contractors from its reserved funds. The 2019 provision was therefore available for transfer \$8,000,000;
- Building of the International Fine Cocoa Innovation Centre A loan from the Caribbean Development Bank was agreed to finance the project \$6,800,000;
- Renovation of Chemistry C1 Building and Replacement of Fume Hoods the costs of the project for fiscal 2019 was less than provision \$10,000,000;
- The Ministry re-prioritized some of its planned activities under the following nine (9) Centres and Programmes to meet the urgent need of payment of Salaries \$8,280,929:-
  - Establishment of Diego Martin HYPE Centre
  - Construction of HYPE Admin. And O'Meara Centre
  - National Skills Development Programme
  - Upgrading of Technology Centres at Port of Spain, Pointe-a-Pierre, Ste. Madeleine and Laventille

  - Establishment of Pleasantville Technology Centre
  - Establishment of a Skills and Technology Centre in Debe/Penal
  - Acquisition of Capital Equipment for Metal Industries Company Limited (Legacy)

#### Head 28 – Ministry of Health - \$4,000,000

#### **Reasons for Transfer**

To enable the Urban Development Corporation of Trinidad and Tobago (UDeCOTT) to pay outstanding bills for the maintenance of the Couva Children's Hospital and its re-designation to the Couva Medical and Multi-Training Facility (CMMF) - \$4,000,000.

#### **Reasons for Savings**

Savings were realized from the Hospital Refurbishment Programme as the replacement of the feeder cables at the Eric Williams Medical Sciences Complex (EWMSC) were deferred due to a delay in shipment. Also, the upgrade/replacement of standby generators and panels were deferred - \$3,000,000.

Savings were realized from funds allocated for the construction of the Ministry of Health Administrative Building as the land transfer was not finalized in 2019 - \$1,000,000.

#### Head 30 – Ministry of Labour and Small Enterprise Development - \$4,833,021

#### **Reason for Transfer**

To enable the payment of Salaries to staff attached to the Cipriani College of Labour and Cooperative Studies for July to September, 2019 - \$4,833,021.

#### **Reasons for Savings**

Savings were utilized from the Contract Employment vote as the Ministry prioritized its contract positions to meet the shortfall at the Labour College - \$1,010,656.

Funds were identified from several Projects under the Ministry's Development Programme:-

• Delinking the On the Job Training Programme from the National Training Agency – The Ministry is yet to acquire accommodation for the OJT Head Office - \$1,000,000;

The following Projects experienced Administrative delays - \$2,822,365:-

- Determination and Impact of the Minimum Wage level of the Economy
- Development Institution
- Labour Legislation Reform
- Occupational Health and Safety Programme
- Development of a Modernised Labour Market Information Ssytem
- Co-operative Development and Strengthening Programme
- Development of a Child Labour Policy
- Operationalization of the National Tripartite Advisory Council
- Distribution of Assets for Closed Societies Act
- Conduct of a National Baseline Survey on Knowledge, Attitude, Beliefs and Practices on HIV in the Workplace
- Construction of a new Office Complex for OSH Authority

#### Head 40 – Ministry of Energy and Energy Industries - \$14,300,000

#### **Reasons for Transfer**

To enable the payment of Salaries to contract staff as the majority of contract posts were filled as the Ministry embarked on its restructuring and institutional strengthening process - \$4,800,000.

To enable the purchase a new Rock Drill and a Stone Crusher for use by National Quarries Company Limited - \$9,500,000.

#### **Reasons for Savings**

Funds were realized from Salaries and COLA and Vacant Post as several posts remained unfilled during fiscal 2019 - \$1,800,000.

Savings were also realized from Wages and COLA as several Daily-Paid Workers retired and the vacancies were not filled - \$900,000.

The funds provided for Government's Contribution to NIS were more than required as the staff vacancies remained unfilled - \$1,400,000.

Funds were utilized from Minor Equipment Purchases as the Ministry suppressed expenditure to facilitate payment of Salaries to Contract staff - \$700,000.

Savings were realized from the sub-item Shortfall in subsidy re: Sale of Petroleum Products as some of the funds provided to facilitate payment with respect to fuel subsidy was not utilized. The Government of Trinidad and Tobago entered into a Claims Settlement Agreement with the Petroleum Company of Trinidad and Tobago (Petrotrin), National Petroleum Marketing Company Limited and the United Independent Petroleum Marketing Company Limited (UNIPET) which resulted in the offsetting of liabilities in favor of the Government - \$9,500,000.

#### Head 42 – Ministry of Rural Development and Local Government - \$25,792,985

#### **Reasons for Transfer**

To procure ammunition for use in the Training of Municipal Police Officers - \$155,998.

To purchase equipment to outfit the Municipal Police Officers at the Diego Martin Regional Corporation - \$275,973.

To enable the payment of Salaries and Cost of Living Allowance to monthly paid officers of the Ministry under General Administration - \$1,500,000.

To facilitate the payment of Salaries and Cost of Living Allowance to contract staff at the Ministry - \$3,521,000.

To enable the training of four hundred (400) Municipal Police Officers - \$6,146,102.

To facilitate payment of staff at various Corporations:-

- Wages and Cost of Living Allowance to Daily Rated employees of Port of Spain City Corporation - \$3,459,000
- Salaries and Cost of Living Allowance and Other Allowances to additional Municipal Police Officers at the Arima Borough Corporation \$2,349,000
- Salaries and Cost of Living Allowance and other Allowances to additional Municipal Police Officers at the Point Fortin Borough Corporation - \$2,833,000

#### **Reasons for Savings**

The funds provided to enable the purchase of equipment for the Municipal Police Officers at the Diego Martin Regional Corporation were not utilized but were transferred to the appropriate vote to enable the purchase of bullet proof vests, body cameras and radio equipment - \$275,973.

The Community Based Environment Protection and Enhancement Programme (CEPEP) was managed more efficiently realizing savings - \$22,302,100.

Under the Ministry's Development Programme, the project Design of a Comprehensive Local Area

and Regional Development Planning Process experienced administrative delays - \$1,000,000.

Administrative delays experienced under Local Roads and Street Signage Programme resulted in savings - \$1,714,912.

Savings were realized under the Bailey Bridges project as the Ministry had an adequate supply and incurred no further expenditure under the project for 2019 - \$500,000.

#### Head 43 – Ministry of Works and Transport - \$88,119,682

#### **Reasons for Transfer**

To facilitate the payment of Travelling and Subsistence owed to monthly paid officers attached to General Administration and Mechanical Services Division for fiscal 2019 - \$1,000,000.

To pay Companies that provided Janitorial and Security Services to various Departments of the Ministry over the period June 2016 to September 2019 - \$5,959,000.

To meet the cost of Uniforms supplied to the Traffic Warden Unit - \$214,000.

To pay T&TEC for electricity supplied to General Administration and the Traffic Warden Unit - \$604,362.

To meet the cost of telephone services provided to General Administration and the Traffic Warden Unit - \$776,136.

To enable the rental of accommodation to house the Traffic Warden Unit - \$800,000.

To enable the Traffic Management Division to procure safety equipment, spare parts for the repair of traffic signals as well as reflective paints for maintenance of road markings - \$3,780,000.

To enable the Traffic Management Division to pay contractors for the maintenance of high tension cable barriers along the Uriah Butler and Solomon Hochoy Highways as well as Traffic Signals throughout the country - \$8,310,000.

To pay contractors for repair and maintenance work carried out on the Ministry's Head Office building situated at Corner London and Richmond Streets, Port of Spain - \$650,000.

To enable the Traffic Warden Unit to pay outstanding bills to suppliers for services provided as per contract agreements - \$39,000.

To meet the Mediation Settlement cost and associated legal fees in respect of a Court Judgement made against the National Helicopter Services Limited (NHSL) - \$39,424,196.

To facilitate the payment of Salaries to Traffic Wardens for the period August to September 2019 - \$8,000,000.

To enable the Traffic Warden Unit to meet the cost of fuel and lubricants utilized by its vehicles - \$25,000.

To enable the National Helicopter Services Ltd (NHSL) to meet its debt servicing obligations - \$8,442,988.

To enable the National Infrastructure Development Company Ltd (NIDCO) to meet the cost of ship management services for the M.V. Galleons Passage, M.V. T & T Express and four (4) Water Taxis for a period of one (1) year - \$10,095,000.

#### **Reasons for Savings**

Savings became available under Wages and COLA because of the retirement of several Daily Rated Workers in the Mechanical Services Division in fiscal 2019 - \$700,000.

Funding from the three (3) Sub-items shown below was utilized to effect payment in the sum of \$39.4Mn being the mediation settlement cost and associated legal fees in respect of a court judgement made against the NHSL:-

Funding was allocated to the Port Authority of Trinidad and Tobago to meet two (2) payments on

the Principal of a \$71.5Mn loan, however only one (1) payment was required as the loan had matured in March, 2019 - \$3,359,000.

Funding was allocated to the Airport Authority of Trinidad and Tobago to meet four (4) payments of Principal and Interest in respect of a USD\$45.3Mn Fixed Rate Bond however, only three (3) payments were required as the Bond had matured in April of 2019 - \$7,008,498.

The Trinidad and Tobago Spirit was withdrawn from the inter-island ferry service therefore a savings was realized under the Sub-item Port Authority – Contribution towards deficit on Coastal Steamers - \$8,000,000.

Since the undermentioned seven (7) projects under the Ministry's Development Programme were rescheduled for implementation in fiscal 2020, savings were realized as detailed:-

#### Head 67 – Ministry of Planning and Development - \$11,979,512

#### **Reasons for Transfer**

To facilitate the payment of outstanding bills for telephones, janitorial services and official overseas travel - \$699,537.

To enable the payment of Salaries to contract staff to September, 2019 - \$400,000.

To enable the payment of rent for office space and parking facilities at several locations including Nicholas Tower and Capital Plaza - \$2,625,306.

To meet legal fees and the renewal of annual fees for Software and Subscriptions - \$2,053,400.

To enable the renewal of subscriptions for the Library Services Division - \$81,135.

To enable the Central Statistical Office to pay arrears of travelling and subsistence to public officers, cost of telephone services, rental of office space for Port of Spain and Tobago Offices, Janitorial and Security Services - \$3,487,847.

To enable the Urban and Regional Planning Division to meet the cost of telephone services and rental of accommodation; and for payment of salaries to contract staff - \$1,651,000.

To enable the Environmental Policy and Planning Division to pay outstanding bills for promotions, publicity and printing - \$91,002.

To enable the remittance of annual contributions for fiscal 2018 and 2019 to the Commonwealth Fund for Technical Cooperation - \$890,285.

#### **Reasons for Savings**

Funds were utilized from the vote Settlement to Cane Farmers re: 2007 Transition out of the Sugar Industry. Legal action was taken against the Government of Trinidad and Tobago by some cane farmers which resulted in a reduction in the number of contracts processed as the Farmers ceased signing amended contracts - \$3,262,853.

Savings were realized from four (4) Projects under the Ministry's Development Programme as follows:-

- The Relocation of Squatters experienced delays as the Land Settlement Agency was not able to identify suitable sites for relocation of some displaced households \$4,000,000;
- The Upgrade of Plaza San Carlos was delayed pending the recruitment of a Project Manager for the project \$2,716,659;

- The CDA Police Post Headquarters Retrofitting of the Base Building was reviewed by the Board of the Chaguaramas Development Authority who took a decision to defer with regard to the retrofitting of the building in its present design as it is found to be too costly \$997,884;
- The CDA was unable to proceed with the development of five (5) car parks in Chaguaramas as the tender documents were not completed in time \$1,002,116.

Under the Development Programme of the Ministry, the Strategic Redevelopment of T.T.T. Project experienced administrative delays - \$3,000,000.

#### Head 75 - Equal Opportunity Tribunal - \$114,600

#### **Reason for Transfer**

To enable the purchase and installation of cameras and digital access locks to increase the security of the accommodation for the Tribunal - \$114,600.

#### **Reasons for Savings**

Some contract positions became vacant during fiscal 2019 and remained vacant to the end of 2019 yielding savings - \$84,600.

Efforts to increase cost efficiency yielded savings under Electricity and Official Overseas Travel - \$30,000.

#### Head 77 – Ministry of Agriculture, Land and Fisheries - \$65,014,365

#### **Reasons for Transfer**

To meet outstanding amounts due for telecommunication service provided from 2017 - 2019 - \$6,674,224.

To facilitate the payment of travelling and subsistence to staff of the Animal Production and Health Department as some of the provisions were used to pay arrears - \$1,451,498.

To facilitate the payment of legal settlements ordered by the Court and outstanding management fees to National Flour Mills for the operation of the Rice Mill at Carlsen Field - \$6,521,021.

To pay outstanding bills for Janitorial Services provided - \$605,408.

To facilitate the payment of EMBD Principal on \$400Mn loan which matured in July 2019 - \$49,762,214.

#### **Reasons for Savings**

Savings were realized from Salaries and COLA from various Divisions within the Ministry as several posts remained vacant - \$7,756,499.

Savings were realized from the Wages and COLA votes from various Divisions within the Ministry as a result of the retirement of several Daily-Rated Workers whose posts remain vacant - \$17,937,700.

Funds from the University Graduate Recruitment Programme were utilized, as a policy document to enable expenditure was not finalized - \$1,000,000.

Expenditure under Materials and Supplies was suppressed to facilitate more urgent obligations - \$200,000.

Savings were identified from several projects under the Ministry's Development Programme to enable the payment of a loan – EMBD - Principal on \$400.Mn Loan which matured in July 2019:-

- La Reunion-Development and Provision of Facilities-The expansion of the planting material for the cocoa germplasm was halted because the varieties must be compatible for successful cross-pollination for a cocoa plant to produce a pod. The MALF took a policy decision to discontinue production \$400,000
- Commercial Repository The establishment of the nurseries at Catshill and Ecclesville did not commence in 2019 due to a change in the scope of works \$6,262,441
- Improved Management to the Natural Forest -South East Conservancy. The completion of the Nariva Swamp Boat Line Office experienced delays due to a change in the scope of works and the silvicultural marking of the block (trees) for felling was impeded by the inclement weather \$538,019
- Forestry Access Roads The rehabilitation of forestry access roads cost less than estimated \$586,589

- Caroni Swamp Management Project -The planned training activity could not be implemented due to the unavailability of the necessary resource personnel \$783,038
- Establishment of a Land Management Authority Delays were experienced in the recruitment of the necessary resource personnel to operationalize the Land Management Authority - \$500,000
- Redevelopment of the Chaguaramas Agricultural Development Project The irrigation works at the Chaguaramas Agricultural Development Project will be carried out at a later date, at a reduced cost in collaboration with the Water and Sewerage Authority (WASA) \$785,409
- Development and Implementation of a Waste Management System for the Livestock Industry A re-design for the retrofitting of a large shed for the Livestock Industry Project is required therefore, no expenditure was incurred under this project for 2019 -\$1,000,000
  - Fisheries Management Research and Development Programme. Two (2) major activities critical to the project were not undertaken as planned in 2019; the training programme could not be implemented due to the unavailability of qualified resource personnel and the hiring of relevant personnel was not approved.- \$865,126
  - Provision of Office and Other Facilities for South Region An assessment of the works for the electrical upgrade of the Penal Demonstration Centre which is required by the Trinidad and Tobago Electricity Commission (T&TEC) for final approval was not completed by the relevant Ministry. The total allocation was not utilized as a result - \$700,000
  - Farm to Table Project -The construction of the model farm did not commence due to a lack of statutory approvals \$2,000,000
  - Restoration and Management of the Guanapo Watershed There was a delay in the finalization and signing of an agreement between the University of the West Indies (UWI) and the Ministry to conduct training for the restoration of the Guanapo Watershed, as such, no expenditure was incurred for fiscal 2019 \$1,000,000
  - Acquisition of Sites for Non-Agricultural Development Purposes -The Commissioner of State Lands was awaiting a response from the Commissioner of Valuations regarding queries on the valuation of land acquisition for non agricultural development purposes for two (2) sites at Shirvan Road, Tobago \$1,000,000
  - Development of the Queen's Park Savannah There was no expenditure for the Queen's Park Savannah Project because the Ministry of Agriculture, Land and Fisheries is currently exploring the possibility of technical assistance from the Government of Canada. This arrangement would be finalized in fiscal 2020 \$743,240

- Development of Young Entrepreneurs in Ornamental Horticulture in Rural Communities. The expansion of plant collections at the La Pastora Plant Propagation Station was not completed due to a delay in the construction of the saran sheds (sourcing the correct materials) which is a precursor for same -\$418,060
- Survey Plans Restoration Project Training of Surveying and Mapping Division staff in the restoration techniques is dependent on the availability of National Archive Personnel, for which there were significant delays \$1,000,000
- Production of Nautical Charts of the Gulf of Paria The cost of the multi-beam echo sounder was lower than anticipated for the production of Nautical Charts of the Gulf of Paria - \$396,625
- Upgrade of Infrastructure and Information Systems Technical issues with the Wide Area Network needed to be resolved with FLOW Trinidad for several activities under this project to be implemented \$2,066,850
- Establishment of a Spatial Information Management System (SIMS) -The Geographic Information Systems Unit experienced difficulties in sourcing the specialized equipment and software required for the Establishment of a Spatial Information Management System (SIMS) \$988,997
- Upgrade of the Cadastral Management Information System (CMIS) -The hiring of qualified personnel adversely affected the implementation of this project \$1,000,000
- Development of an Electronic Document Management System for State Land The Geographic Information Systems Unit experienced difficulties in sourcing the specialized equipment and software required for the Development of an Electronic Document Management System for State Land \$421,032
- Implementation of an action plan to address illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing in the ports and waters under the jurisdiction of Trinidad and Tobago The delayed approval for the hiring of the necessary personnel negatively impacted the implementation of an action plan \$1,154,001
- Renovation and Extension of Buildings and Offices Anticipated infrastructural works at the Ministry's Head Office UBH Chaguanas was reviewed and re-scoped and is expected to be completed in fiscal 2020 \$1,492,085
- Upgrade of Centeno Livestock Station The planned training activity in artificial insemination of livestock could not be implemented due to the unavailability of qualified resource personnel. Also the scope of works for the pasture rehabilitation at Centeno Livestock Station had to be amended \$664,582
- Upgrade of the Artificial Breeding Centre (ABC) The Artificial Insemination Technician's office and the administrative office at the Artificial Breeding Centre at

Centeno Livestock Station had further deteriorated and required an amendment to the original scope of works - \$649,403

- Aerial and Lidar Survey of Trinidad and Tobago A delay in the hiring of staff to conduct the vector extraction exercise (aerial photography) adversely impacted the implementation of the Aerial and Lidar Survey of Trinidad and Tobago. The Ministry would be outsourcing same abroad in collaboration with the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) who has done similar work in Barbados \$4,921,475
- Other Projects which had small balances of unutilized provision \$5,783,194.
